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## Miniaturization and Exposure Wavelength





Cost and difficulty heavily dependent on  $k_1$  factor. Smaller  $k_1$  factor means higher exposure cost.



## ArF Liquid Immersion Lithography vs EUV Lithography

ArF Liquid Immersion Lithography for hp 45 nm and below.

- Pros: It is like a Conventional Optical Lithography. Almost all the infrastructures already exist.
- Cons: Ultra Low  $k_1$  Factor required. Lithography Friendly Design must be introduced. Multiple Exposure will be indispensable for  $k_1 < 0.3$ Polarization effects must be considered. Extendibility will be a key issue. CoO and Resist LER will be critical Issues.

EUV Lithography for hp 45 nm and below.

- Pros: It uses Reduction Projection System. Extendibility to hp 22 nm will be expected. No complicated OPC and RET are required. Conventional design can be applied.
- Cons: Total new infrastructures must be developed. Availability of the Defect-free Mask is the key issue. CoO and Resist LER will be critical Issues.
